When considering publication venues, it is important to consider how the journal will help you reach your intended audience through the databases it's indexed in and open access on the internet. Impact factor, a metric calculated with the yearly average number of citations, may also influence publication decisions. All journals included in this table have published IPE or IPP content.

Citation Databases

- Directions:
 - 1. Complete a topic search
 - 2. On the results page, click Analyze Results
 - 3. Rank the records by the "Source Titles" field
 - 4. Use "View Records" to see the articles published in the journal
- Alternatively, use the "Source Titles" filter on the left of the search results to view the result count by journal title

Journal Scope and Author Guidelines

- Journal Scope
 - Use the journal's scope to determine whether your topic is a good fit for the journal
- Journal Sections and Manuscripts Accepted
 - Ensure that the type of manuscript best suited to your scholarship is accepted by the journal
- Author Guidelines
 - Follow all author guidelines to improve chances of acceptance
 - Example: the Journal of Interprofessional Care's IPE Terminology list in the <u>Instructions for Authors</u>

Terminology

Given the ongoing terminological uncertainty within the interprofessional field, the Journal now employs a range of key terms – each with an associated definition*. Submitting authors therefore need to ensure they select terms that best describes the activities presented in their work. They should also ensure they use the selected terms consistently:

Disciplines are regarded as broad academic fields, with examples including, anthropology, economics, geography, social science and political science.

Interdisciplinary teamwork is an approach like interprofessional teamwork (see below) but differs as the team members are composed of individuals from different disciplines such as psychology, anthropology, economics and geography.

Interprofessional collaboration involves different health and social care professions who regularly come together to negotiate and agree how to solve complex care problems or provide services. It differs from interprofessional teamwork as colleagues do not share a team identity and work together in a less integrated and interdependent manner.
